Unlike some other states, a resident's boat, motor and the trailer must be licensed in

Texas to prevent future theft, among other reasons.

The Pinches first docked their boat at Silver Lake Marina, but the lure of Big Daddy's great food, new dockage slips, plus the shorter distance from home to their boat, convinced them to move their boats and watercraft to Scott's Landing Marina. There is also a third marina on the lake, Twin Cove Marina. All facilities are owned by one company, Marinas International and have a combined 1,400 moorings with land-based storage for an additional 575 vessels.
